Hodson Gallery of Hood College presents an exhibition of sculptures and paintings by Jim Condron. The artist uses materials such as paint, fur, bits of plastic, architectural remnants, socks, candy, vintage light bulbs, and fur to make sculptures. Condron collects objects over years for their personal resonance and gradually assembles them, adding paint and various glues and mediums. Color and texture dominate. The paintings and sculptures allude to childhood, youth, aging, ease, tension, weather, holidays, seasons, anxiety, absurdity, food, frustration, music, melancholy, tedium, trends, and great happiness. Despite the painterly combination of disparate parts, Condron's work confronts personal and historical narratives. In this exhibition, Condron introduces elements of Hood College's history and invites viewers, students and alumni to contemplate personal and collective memories constructed through their college experience.
