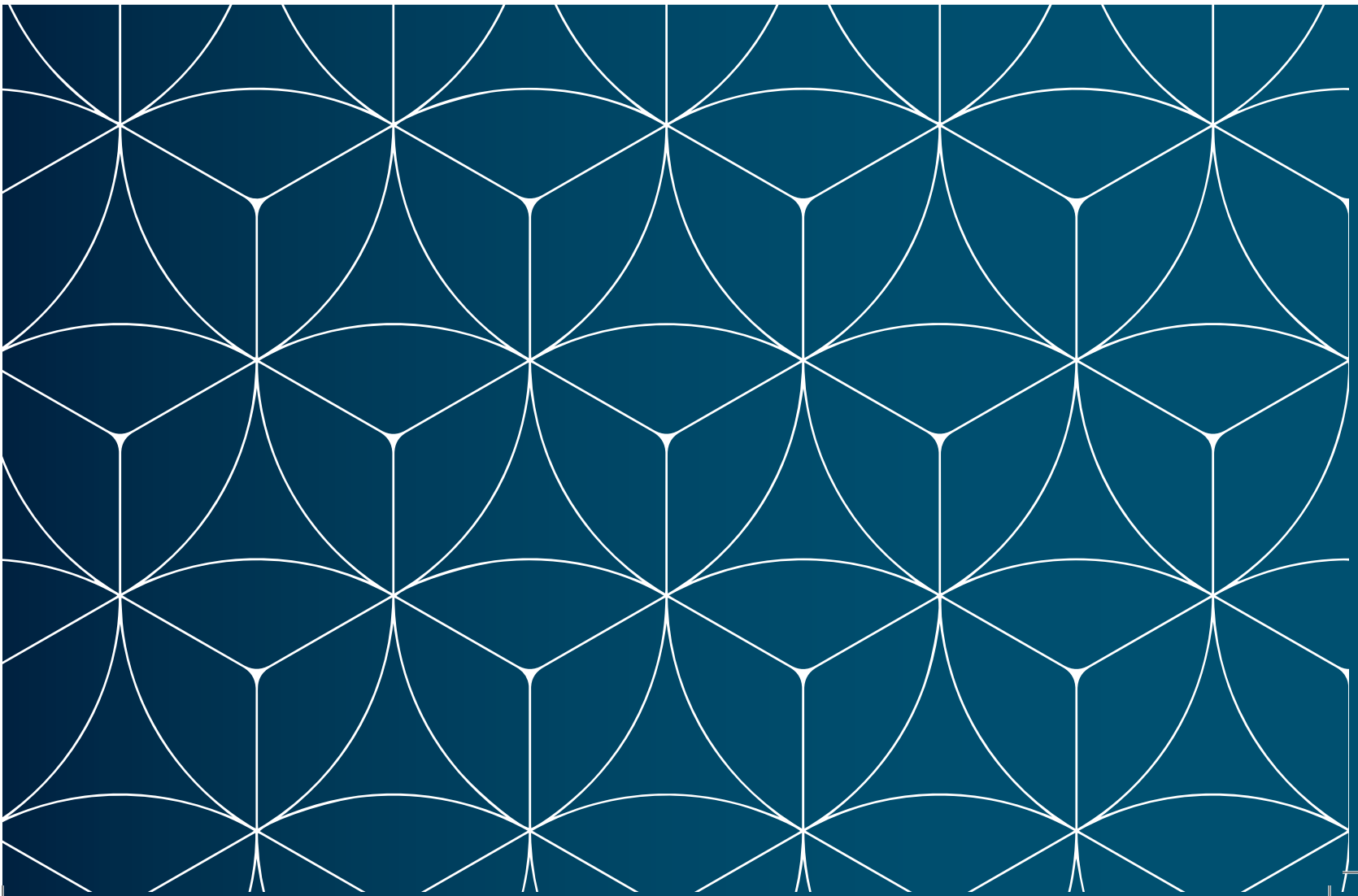

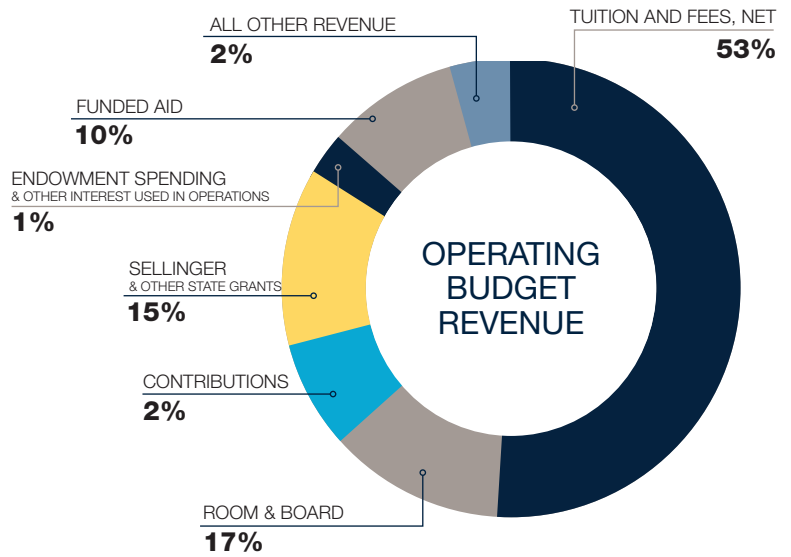

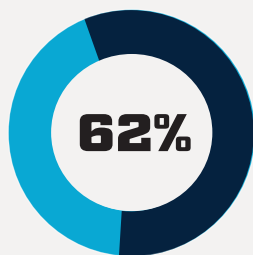
Partnerships:

Frederick stands as the third point in a powerful economic triangle with DC and Baltimore. **HOOD COLLEGE** boasts **strong partnerships** with **NINE of the 10 TOP EMPLOYERS* IN FREDERICK:**

1. **Fort Detrick** and Hood have a memorandum of understanding that provides graduate scholarships for active duty military stationed at the army base in Frederick.
2. **Frederick County Public Schools** is the employer to more than 225 of *Hood College alumni*, including FCPS's superintendent.
3. **Frederick Hospital** partners with Hood to provide primary and urgent care, health and wellness for our students; and scholarships, internships and employment for nursing students and graduates.
4. **Frederick County Government** provides space for the Martha E. Church Center for Community and Civic Engagement in ROOT.
5. **Leidos Biomedical/Frederick National Laboratory for Cancer Research** partners with Hood on the national bi-annual symposium on cancer research, and provide research and internship opportunities for our students.
6. **Frederick Community College** and Hood have several articulation agreements in place to aid students in their transition from two-year to four-year education.
7. **Thermo Fisher Scientific** provides internships and research opportunities for our students and employs our graduates; was the lead sponsor for the Blue & Grey Golf Tournament.
8. **City of Frederick government** employees and their dependents, as part of the NeighborHOOD partner program, are eligible for scholarships for undergraduate and graduate degrees.
9. **Costco Wholesale**
10. **AstraZeneca** provides internships for our students; their employees work as adjunct professors; and AZ was a sponsor of a recent academic symposium on cancer imaging co-hosted with Leidos.

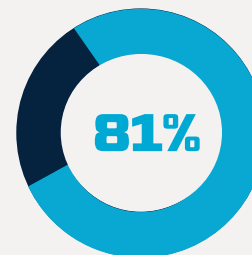

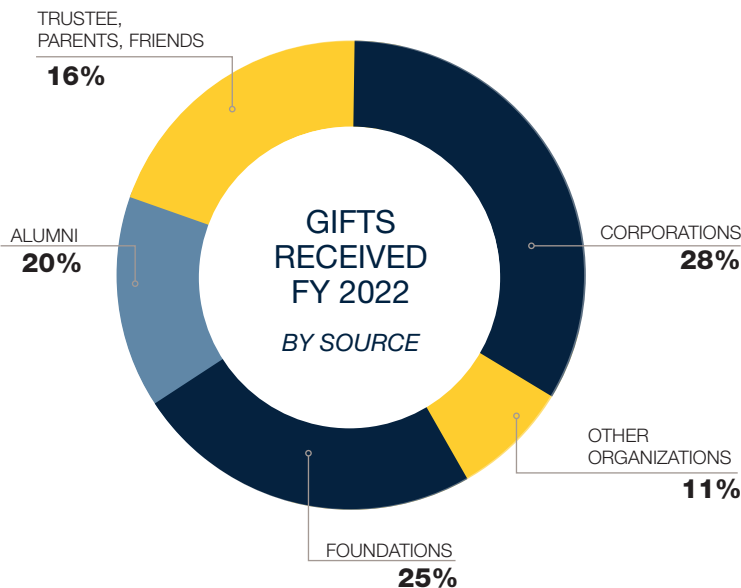

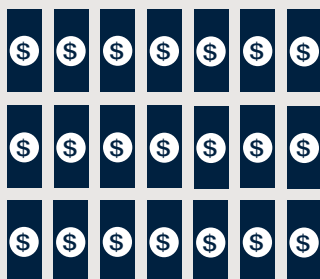

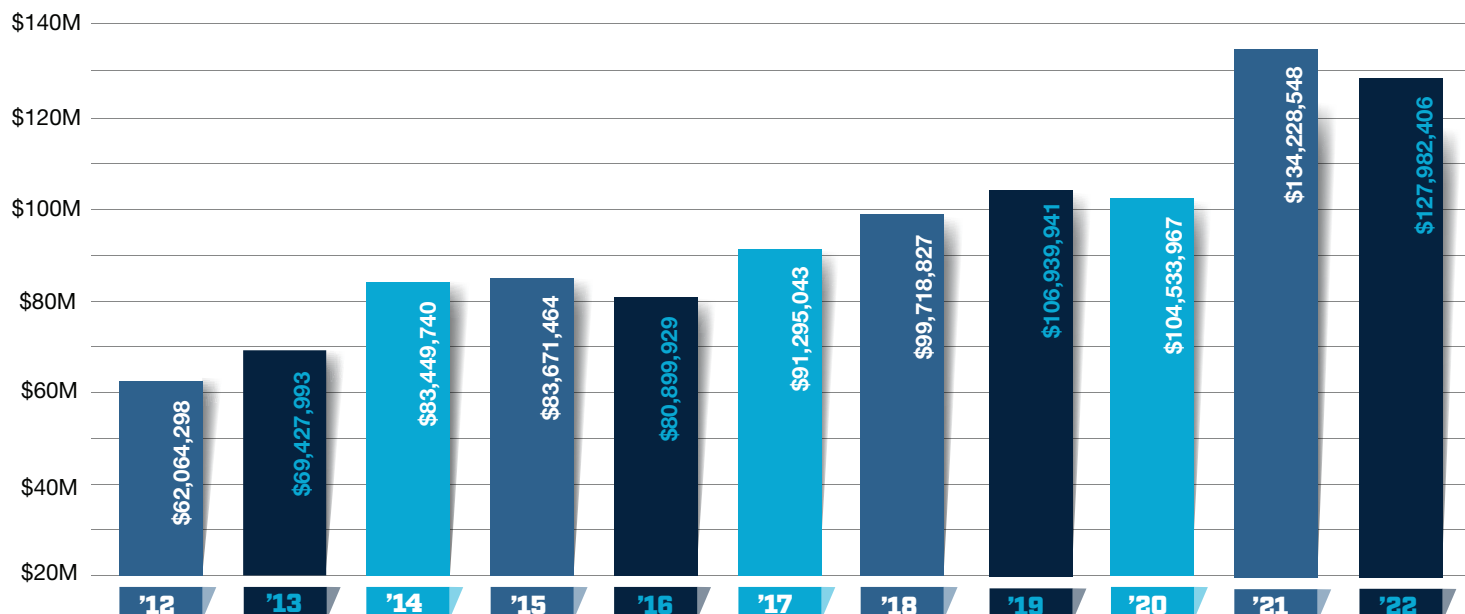
