

Director's Updates - Enrollment

Demographics

- 98 students (Fall 2022)
 - 50% full time
- 85% female
- 75% White; 14% Black; 5% Hispanic/Latino; 3% Asian
 - Slight increase in diversity
- 75.5% CMHC; 24.5% SC
- Mean age: 29
 - Significant drop from 31
 - Applications from seniors, 4Plus

Enrollment/admissions

- Highest ever credit counts in Fall 2022 (724) and Spring 2023 (797)
- 33 applications for Spring 2023; admitted 21 (63.6%) and enrolled 19 (90% yield)
- 54 applications for Fall 2023; admitted 36 (66.6%) and 26 enrolled (72% yield)
 - Met targets, consistent with last year



Director's Updates - Graduates

- 29 graduates from September 2022-June 2023
 - 25 CMHC and 4 SC
- Surpassed milestone of 100 program graduates
 - Save the Date: September 29, 2023

Director's Updates (Cont.)

- HRSA Scholars Program
 - Full funding for identified students from economically or educationally disadvantaged backgrounds, with an interest in working in medically underserved communities and/or primary care
 - 15 current, 21 total, 6 graduates



Director's Updates (Cont.)

- HRSA BWHET Grant Year 2
 - \$180,000 in stipends grated to 18 interns working with underserved populations
 - NeighborHOOD Counseling and Training Center (NCTC) moved to 700 Toll House
 - Actively serving Hood students AND local community members
 - Forming community partnerships (e.g., FCC)



Neighborhood Counseling and Training Center (NCTC)

- NCTC has served 55 clients since opening
 - 40 Hood students, 15 community members
- 21 active clients
 - 17 Hood students
 - 26 in May; referrals out, summer, new location
- 9 current Cls
 - An additional 7-10 in Fall 2023





Director's Updates (Cont.)

- Curricular updates
 - Trauma, Crisis, Grief & Loss (TCGL)
 - Successfully launched certificate program
 - 12 credits
 - Trauma & Crisis Intervention; Grief, Loss, Mourning &
 Bereavement; Developmental OR Hist./Mult. Perspectives in
 Thanatology; Electives
 - 10 dually enrolled COUN students and 5 standalone certificate students (incl. 1 alum)



Director's Update (Cont.)

- Curricular updates
 - Doctoral (Ph.D.) Program in Counselor Education and Supervision approved by BoT in June 2023
 - First Ph.D. program at Hood College
 - Projected start date of August 2024
 - Cohorts of 6-8

- Most students now doing a mix of in-person and telehealth



Practicum & Internship Updates for CMHC

- Currently 25 students in the field; 14 slated to start in Spring '24
- Added 10 new sites; 2 additional are pending final approval
 - Group private practices, child therapy, and community mental health settings

 - In Fall 2023: 4 in Internship I
 - Continued pipeline concerns due to small enrollment in the SC Specialty...

School Counseling Specialty Updates

- MSDE Special Education Requirement
 - All Spring 2023 graduates met the MDSE requirement and received the "stamp" on their transcript prior to graduation
- The Lauryn's Law course "COUN 5990: Crisis Response, Suicide Prevention, and Lauryn's Law" continues to be offered.
 - Current school counselors seeking recertification have expressed interest in this course and have enrolled.
 - Students continue to express interest and enroll.





Assessment – Demographics

Gender

- Women have higher overall mean KPI scores than men (3.59 > 3.43)
 - Men scoring more poorly on all but three KPIs
 - Largest gaps on Culture, Career, Theory, Diagnosis
- Transgender students not included due to low number

Race/Ethnicity

- Students of color have lower overall mean KPI scores than White students (3.53 < 3.61), though the gap continues to shrink
 - Lower scores on all but two KPIs
 - Largest gaps on Assessment,
 School-Based Mental Health



Assessment Considerations

- Ongoing adjustments to Key Assignment Performance Assessments
 - Already completed for Theories, Diagnosis, Advanced Techniques, Ethics, Multicultural, Substance Use
- CACREP
 - Upcoming CACREP accreditation report
 - New 2023 Standard release and reaccreditation
- Review of possible reliability issues in assessment
 - No consistent differences in assessment outcomes based on course format
 - Inconsistent grading style/rigor when different faculty teach the same course
 - On review of this year's data we have identified differences in certain faculty members assessment of the same KAPAs
 - Upcoming meeting to discuss reliability and consistency in assessment and weighting of assignments
- Continued support for students of color and men
 - HRSA Scholars support program
- Possible change to gender identification language
 - Currently "Male (Cis or Trans)," "Female (Cis or Trans)," and "Nonbinary"



2022 Feedback Areas

- More preparation for the NCE
 - Working on workshops through CSI or external provider
- Cohort model
 - Students appreciate flexibility; may consider for SC in the future.
- Experience in multiple placement settings
 - Challenge: Many sites like to keep students for 2-3 semesters.
 - Idea: Practicum at NCTC for all students, OR at hospital/agency setting
- Gatekeeping and student dispositions
 - Implementation of structured advising process using Counseling Competencies Scale-Revised (CCS-R) at introductory, pre-practicum, and throughout practicum & internship
 - More selective admissions process as a key gate



2023-24 Action Plan

- Hold enrollment steady
- Continue to work to diversify student body
 - Increase supports for students of color
- Recruit and retain more SC students
- Continue to expand NCTC and consider it as primary practicum site
- Advertise and recruit more students for TCGL
- Continue to prepare curriculum for PhD program and begin recruitment
