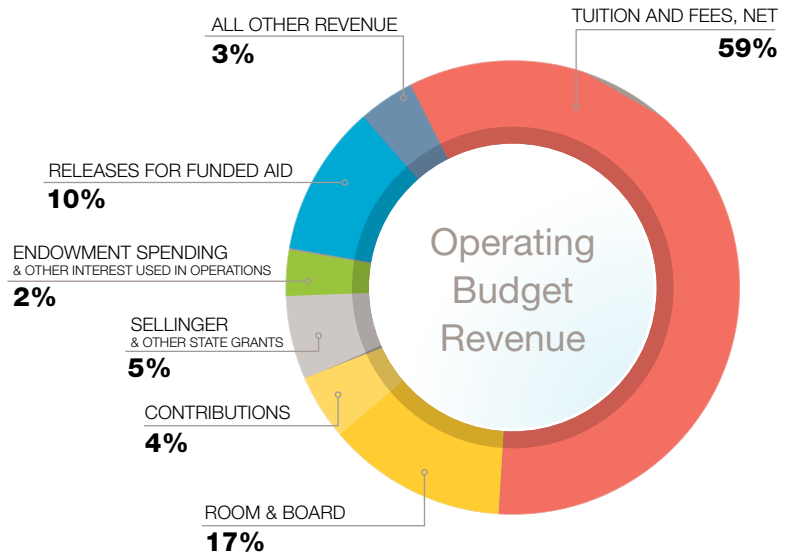

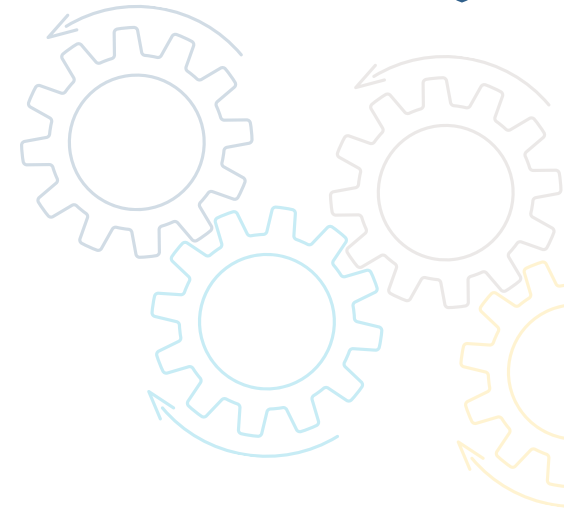


TOP 10 EMPLOYERS

PARTNERSHIPS:

Frederick stands as the third point in a powerful economic triangle with DC and Baltimore. **HOOD COLLEGE** boasts **strong partnerships** with the **EIGHT of the 10 TOP EMPLOYERS* IN FREDERICK:**

1. **Fort Detrick** and Hood have a memorandum of understanding that provides graduate scholarships for active duty military stationed at the army base in Frederick.
2. **Frederick County Public Schools** is the employer to more than 550 *Hood College* alumni.
3. **Frederick Memorial Hospital** partners with Hood to provide primary and urgent care, health and wellness, mental health, and men's and women's health services to our students.
4. **Frederick County Government** provides space for the Martha E. Church Center for Community and Civic Engagement in ROOT.
5. Wells Fargo
6. **Frederick Community College** and Hood have several articulation agreements in place to aid students in their transition from two-year to four-year education.

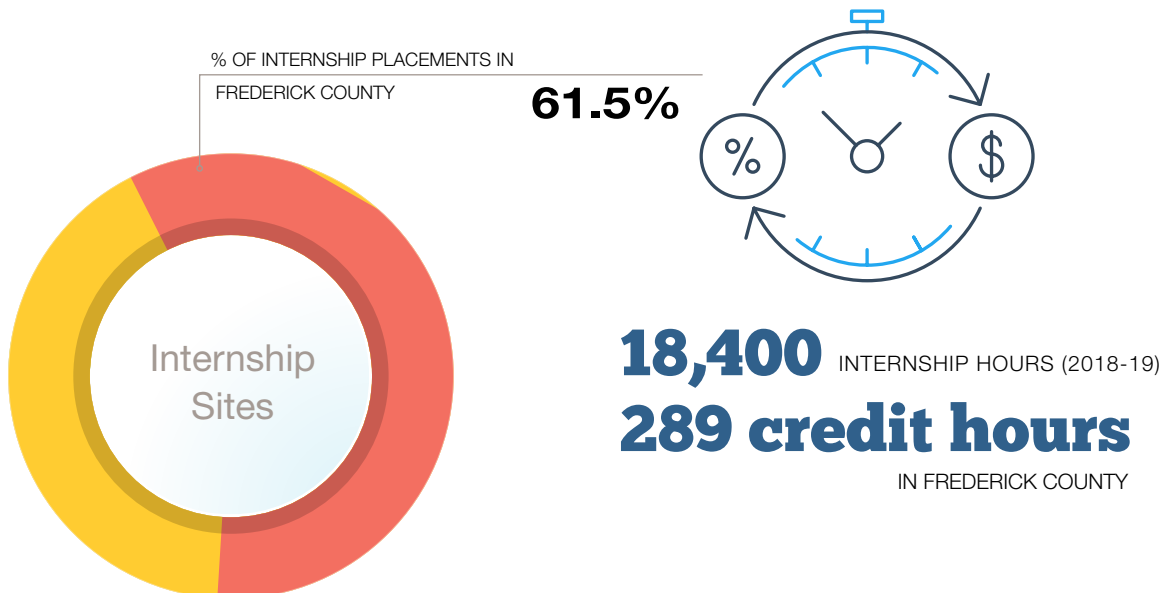
