




Frederick stands as the third point in a powerful economic triangle with DC and Baltimore. HOOD COLLEGE boasts strong partnerships with the EIGHT of the 10 TOP EMPLOYERS* IN FREDERICK:

- Fort Detrick and Hood have a memorandum of understanding that provides graduate scholarships for active duty military stationed at the army base in Frederick.
- 2. Frederick County Public Schools is the employer to more than 550 Hood College alumni.
- Frederick Memorial Hospital partners with Hood to provide primary and urgent care, health and wellness, mental health, and men's and women's health services to our students.
- Frederick County Government provides space for the Martha E. Church Center for Community and Civic Engagement in ROOT.
