The Graduate Student Association (GSA) Corner



New Nutrition Master's Program Launching this Spring

We are excited to welcome our first class of new students for our brand-new master's in Nutrition Science program officially launching spring semester 2023. The program consists of three unique tracks: <u>Dietetics Licensure</u>, <u>General Studies</u>, and <u>Sustainability Studies</u>.

We are now accepting <u>applications</u> for the spring 2023 cohort, so spread the word. Whether you're a current senior ready to pursue graduate studies, or a community member looking for a career shift or promotion, a graduate degree in nutrition leads to several career paths from a registered dietician who works in nearly every healthcare and school setting in the U.S. to a nutritionist on the leading edge of the farm-to-table movement and other food-sustainability sectors. As an interdisciplinary field, nutrition is deeply rooted in chemistry, biology and the social sciences. Thus, this three-track program allows graduates to specialize in the fields of dietetics (including clinical nutrition), food security, molecular nutrition, nutritional biochemistry, public health nutrition and immunology nutrition.

Take Advantage of Hood's 4PLUS Dual-Degree Program



This past academic year, we connected with over 150 undergraduate students across 14 different campus events to talk about the many ways <u>The Graduate School</u> supports our undergraduate students. Whether it was in the quad, in the classroom or online, it was great meeting so many new students, and we look forward to meeting many more to start the 2022-23 academic year!

Hood's <u>4PLUS program</u> is an accelerated, dual-degree program that allows undergraduate students to begin graduate coursework as early as their junior year. Eligible students can earn both their bachelor's and master's degrees in as little as 5 years. The <u>4PLUS</u> <u>program</u> includes the following master's degrees:

- Master's in Business Administration (MBA).
- M.S. in Information Technology
- <u>M.S. in Cybersecurity</u>
- M.S. in Clinical Mental Health or School Counseling
- <u>M.S. in Environmental Biology</u>
- <u>M.S. in Biomedical Science</u>

Current undergraduate students and recent alumni also receive special benefits for applying to the graduate school through our <u>ALTY (Alumni of the Last Three Years) scholarship program</u>. Benefits include waiving the application fee, last three graduate credits at no cost, and an expedited admission process. Hunger at Hood?

Free Online Tutoring Available for Hood Graduate Students!

One of the many excellent support services we provide busy graduate students is online tutoring and writing support with live, professional help. ThinkingStorm is our provider, which allows us to provide graduate students with free, online tutoring. To access online tutoring, click on the ThinkingStorm link in any of your Blackboard classrooms (under Tools). You will be automatically signed in to the online tutoring site; no separate username or password is required.

ThinkingStorm is available up to 24/7 for topics like Writing, Math, Science, Statistics, and more. Once you're logged in, simply use the menus on the ThinkingStorm homepage to connect with your desired option. Live support is available for most subjects, and you can also submit essays for asynchronous feedback via the ThinkingStorm Writing Center. Hood College is pleased to announce a new partnership with the Frederick County Chamber of Commerce whereby our doctoral program in organizational leadership, led by Dr. Nisha Manikoth, will provide an expanded and enhanced curriculum to the Leadership Frederick County (LFC) program. The 2022-23 Leadership Frederick County program will feature embedded leadership masterclasses, marking the first time in the program's history that graduate-level leadership instruction has been incorporated into the curriculum. Leadership Frederick County has been training emerging and existing leaders in the Frederick County community for 33 years, graduating more than 1,500 leaders to date. The nine-month experiential program offers an intensive and up-close look at the issues and opportunities facing the region. LFC introduces leaders to the realities, opportunities and challenges of Frederick County's civic and business communities and gives participants the opportunity to experience the power of working with other community leaders and organizations to influence positive growth and advancement of the region. The class meets monthly from August to May with program days focused on facets of the community such as history, agriculture, economic development, health and human services, and government. Dr. Manikoth has developed several new "value added" components to the LFC experience, which will be sure to keep this program first in its class.




Nov 16: Diwali
