STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

Honors student Sai Jallow '22 studied economics and political science. After transferring to Hood from Montgomery College, she served as a resident assistant, vice president of the Model UN Club, secretary of the Feminist Student Union, and treasurer / diversity and inclusion representative for Hood College Hillel. She was also a teaching assistant for the Introduction to Macroeconomics course

Alongside two other honors students—Maryam Iftikhar and Maria Silva—Jallow completed a Davis Peace Project after being awarded a \$10,000 grant. Their project addressed the lack of accessible resources for immigrants and refugees in the United States, providing direct assistance to families in disadvantaged communities. Jallow says, "I have come to really appreciate the interdisciplinary nature of the honors program, as well as the rigor and creativity that is expected of honors students. I feel both nurtured and challenged here!"

HOW DO I APPLY TO THE HONORS PROGRAM?

When you apply to the College, simply click the box that says you'd like your application to be reviewed for the Honors Program. The program is highly selective and space is limited. Each applicant is thoroughly reviewed.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO GET IN?

We're looking for students who are intellectually curious both inside and outside of their intended major. While each student is considered for the program based on a holistic review of all submitted materials, these are the basic requirements for *first-year applicants*:

- Strong writing skills demonstrated in the application essay and/or additional materials
- Minimum recalculated academic GPA of 3.3
- College preparatory high school curriculum (if offered)
- AP, IB or Dual Enrollment courses (if offered)

For *transfer students*, we are looking for:

- Strong written communication skills
- Minimum 3.3 GPA from previous institution
- Prior successful participation in an honors program (if offered)

The priority application deadline for Honors is **January 15**. Space is limited, so the earlier you apply, the better. Notifications will be sent to students by the end of January. Applications received after January 15 will be considered for admission if space is still available.
