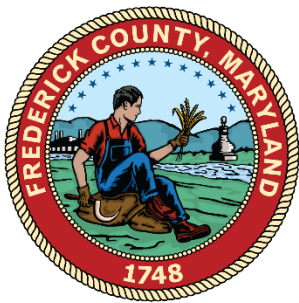

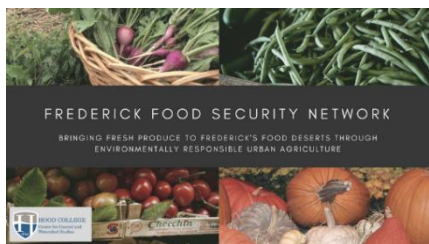

The Department of Emergency Communications serves as the PSAP (Public Safety Answering Point) answering and distribution point for all 911 emergency and non-emergency request for assistance in Frederick County. The Communications Center provides both Basic 911 and Enhanced 911 (E911), which provides more specific location information on the whereabouts of a wireless caller by using latitude and longitude. Within the past year, we began TEXT to 911. This allows the public to TEXT an emergency to 911. We are working on a NEXTGEN 911 (NG911), which will allow pictures and videos to be sent to 911 along with texting.

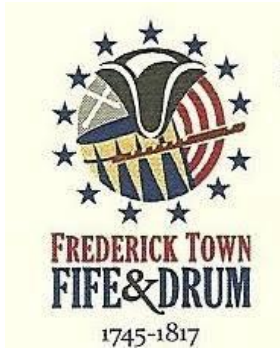

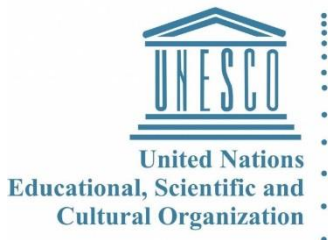
