



Declaration of Major, Minor, and Certificate Undergraduate

- An academic department may refuse to accept as a major, or may drop as a major, a student whose GPA in the discipline falls below 2.0.
- Departments may require students to provide an unofficial copy of the Hood transcript, which is available through Self Service.
- Nursing Majors: *students may declare a pre-nursing major and will not be fully accepted into the nursing pre-licensure major until BIOL 104, BIOL 204 and CHEM 100 or CHEM 101 are completed with grades of C or higher; and 24 credits have been earned with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75.*
- Credit requirements are as follows: *Single Degree and Double Major- 124 credits, Double Degree (BA and BS)- 154 credits*

4Plus – Undergraduate/Graduate Dual Degree Programs

The 4Plus undergraduate/graduate dual degree programs allow students in most cases to complete both the bachelor's and master's degrees in an accelerated format. An undergraduate cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 is required for acceptance into the 4Plus program path.

The **MBA** degree is available to students from any undergraduate major who complete the recommended coursework during the final 2-3 semesters of their undergraduate degree, often allowing the MBA to be earned with just one additional year of study (summer included).

Some master's degree programs allow undergraduate students to complete master's degrees in a shortened time by permitting up to nine (9) credits of graduate coursework to be applied towards both degrees (bachelor's and master's). A minimum grade of B in graduate coursework is required for transfer to a graduate program. Current programs available for this option are:

- B.A./M.S. in Environmental Science/Environmental Biology
- B.A./M.S. in Biology/Biomedical Science
- B.A./ M.S. in Biochemistry/Biomedical Science
- B.A./M.S. in Sustainability Studies/Nutrition
- B.A./M.S. in Psychology/Counseling
- B.A./M.S. in Art Therapy/Counseling
- B.A. (any major) or B.S./M.S. in Cybersecurity
- B.A. (any major) or B.S./M.S. in Information Technology
